

# TEACHING ASSISTANT, ARTS 1110 JOB POSTING

Do you have a love for writing and learning? Comfortable sharing your knowledge with groups? Want meaningful work on campus helping students acheive their goals? ARTS 1110: Introduction to University is hiring TA's for Fall 2025 and Winter 2026!

Arts 1110 introduces first-year students to typical university study and writing expectations. As a W designated course (fulfilling the Written English Requirement), Arts 1110 supports student learning and writing through a two-part structure, with a large weekly lecture section taught by an instructor and a smaller weekly writing lab taught by a teaching assistant. Each TA plans and teaches one weekly writing lab with a maximum of 30 students and marks all assignments for those students.

#### **Job Description**

- Work one-to-one with students at any stage of the writing process on a variety of writingrelated issues such as focus, thesis statement, organization, coherence, clarity, referencing, and grammar
- Facilitate drop-in sessions and group tutoring appointments
- Guide students as they develop their revising and editing skills
- Provide, recommend, and model effective use of resources related to academic writing
- Provide encouragement and build student confidence and agency in the writing process
- Participate in ongoing writing program initiatives in specific courses
- Register students, make appointments, and complete reports in the ALC's online appointment system
- Prepare instructional/resource materials, such as tip sheets, PowerPoints, and exercises, and present to students in a variety of settings including tutorials, classrooms, group sessions, and online
- Participate in other ALC initiatives (depending on interests, experience, and skills) - such other related duties as may be assigned, e.g., participate in meetings with course instructors, attend lectures, etc.

#### Job Requirements / Qualifications

- Must be a UM student in good academic standing, continuing studies in Fall 2025.
- Minimum GPA of 3.0, strong background in essay writing, and completion of at least 45 credit hours at the undergraduate level; note that past academic performance may be a significant factor in selection decisions.
- An empathetic approach to the instructional needs and concerns of students
- Demonstrated interpersonal and communication skills to support students with differing levels of experience, ability, and confidence with academic writing (patience, ability to provide clear explanations, demonstrated ability to work effectively with others)
- Demonstrated ability to work effectively with students of diverse educational, age, racial, ethnic, and cultural backgrounds
- Experience, knowledge and/or understanding of Indigenous cultures and histories considered an asset; Indigenous students are strongly encouraged to apply.
- Both undergraduate and graduate students are encouraged to apply
- · Work schedule: 0-20 hours weekly
